Brief History of Juneteenth

Juneteenth is a holiday that is celebrated for the day the last slaves found out about the Emancipation Proclamation and gained their freedom in Galveston, Texas on June 19th, 1865.

On January 1st, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, which granted freedom to all of the slaves in the Confederate army. News like this is expected to spread quickly across the country and be enforced, but that was not the case. Since the South's leader, Robert E. Lee, did not surrender to the North until 1865, many of the Southern states kept their slaves and did not grant them freedom. Once General Lee surrendered to the United States Union, U.S. Major General Gordon Granger traveled to Galveston, Texas, and told the slaves there that the Emancipation Proclamation proclaimed them to be free.

Slaves reacted in many ways once they found out. Some left their plantations immediately to find their family members, while others made negotiations with their former slave masters for work, and others began to party in the streets. Not all the former slave masters accepted the news, and some began to treat the new freed slaves with violence.

As years went on, communities in Texas began to celebrate this day as Emancipation Day, Jubilee Day, or Juneteenth (which is a combination of the words "June" and "nineteenth"). It was at first celebrated in churches where they would hold games, eat food, sing and dance, and the Proclamation would be read.

The holiday continued to spread, and in 1872 four men, Richard Allen, Richard Brock, Elias Dibble, and Jack Yates, raided money to buy land in Houston Texas for the purpose of celebrating Juneteenth. The Park is called Emancipation Park, and it is one of the oldest parks in Texas today. In 2021, President Joe Biden declared Juneteenth as a federal holiday to be celebrated across the country, and many Americans have embraced the holiday with open arms.

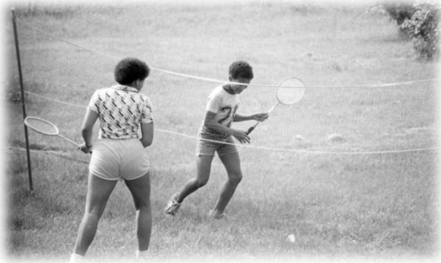
Rebert briefly attended Northeastern University. He worked for most of his adult life at Avon Sole Company in Avon, MA and Components Company in West Bridgewater concurrently. Rebert was a sports enthusiast. He never missed any of his children's games or practices. He enjoyed home improvement projects, cars, and history. He found joy being with his group of friends from church and work. Most of all he loved his children

Anne, mother, homemaker and nurse's aide, went on to obtain her GED in 1968 and received her Licensed Practical Nurse degree in 1971. Anne was an avid gardener, seamstress and active member in her church. Anne's garden produced vegetables for her family from Summer to late Fall. She loved her large circle of friends. She enjoyed reading, puzzles, painting and art in other mediums. Her greatest love was being a mother and grandmother.

Rebert and Anne are remembered by their children as being loving, supportive and engaged parents. They were industrious, strong in their faith and instilled these sentiments in their children. Both felt blessed to have a home and yard big enough to contain their 8 children. They loved the beauty, peace, safety and quality of education that Bridgewater offered.

Their children feel so blessed to have had Anne and Rebert as their parents. Parents who had the foresight to move them to Bridgewater where they all thrived in their comfortable home with a half-acre of treelined land that included both flower and vegetable gardens!

Charlotte E. Ray

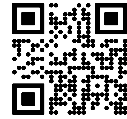
